Education - Recognition of the Lower Primary and Upper Primary Sections - English medium school run by the Cochin Refineries Limited - Sanctioned -

ORDER

The Personnel Manager, Cochin Refineries Limited has represented to Government that the Refinery is situated 12 miles away from Ernakulam where there are no facilities for the employees to educate their children and that the Company had therefore started, at their expense, a Lower primary and an upper primary sections at ambalamugal during the academic year 1966-67 with the medium of instruction as English. At that time the Company was under the impression that the Central Board of Secondary Education would recognise all the classes up to Class XI. On account of the All India nature of the employees, the Company ~~therefore~~ proposes to have this as an English Medium School identical to the Central Schools of the Government of India and to get it affiliated to the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi. But, according to the rules of the Central Board of Secondary Education, no such institution shall be recognised by them unless its primary and upper primary sections are recognised by the concerned State Government. The Company has therefore requested that recognition may be given for all the classes in the lower primary and upper primary sections of the Cochin Refineries Educational Aid Society School with effect from the year 1966-67.

2. The Director of Public Instruction who was consulted in the matter has stated that as per rules of the Central Board, no new institution will be recognised unless lower primary and middle sections are recognised by the concerned State Government. The school authorities are in a very difficult situation because they do not have recognition for the lower classes and hence they may not get recognition of the Central Board of Secondary Education for the High School Classes. The children who have been admitted to the seven classes will be

put to considerable difficulties and their future education will be uncertain. It is also stated that the school was started and the classes were begun last year. The Director of Public Instruction has therefore recommended that the recognition sought for by the Cochin Refineries Limited may be accorded as a special case.

3. In the circumstances, Government are pleased to accord recognition, as a special case under Rule 3 Chapter I of Kerala Education Rules, for all the classes in the lower primary and upper primary sections of the Cochin Refineries Educational Aid Society School at Ambalamugal with effect from the academic year, 1966-67.
