It gives me immense pleasure to present the 56th Annual Report of Cochin Refineries School for the academic year 2022-23, showcasing our progress and the significant milestones we have achieved during the past year.

The results of the school in the SSCE & SSE is an indicator of the academic excellence that the school maintains. CRS has achieved 100% results in both classes X & XII CBSE examinations and our students have proved that "Success is the sum of small efforts, repeated day in and day out."

Presenting a quick summary of the CBSE 2023 EXAM RESULTS.

In Class XII, 94 students appeared for the exam, out of which 22 students got A1 in all subjects which is a new record set. 82 students secured distinction and 12 with first class. The school topper in the Science stream is MANASA K securing 96.6 %. New records have been set in class XII Sc too, wherein 27.4% students secured A1 in all subjects.

The school topper in the Commerce stream is ADITHYAN K ABHILASH securing 99.2%, which again is a record performance. Centums were scored in the Commerce stream for the subjects Economics, Accountancy and Business Studies.

In Class X, 80 students appeared for the CBSE exam of which 10 students secured A1 in all subjects, 65 distinctions and 13 first class.

The school topper is MANJARAY M RAJESH securing 98.6 %. Centums were scored in subjects Malayalam, Science & Social Science.

The CBSE toppers of CRS were felicitated by the Kochi Sahodaya at Choice school.
